

To write a persuasive text

Today, we are going to write our persuasive text using the plan from yesterday. Remember to keep to the same topic.

Here is an example to help you learn how to turn your plan into a persuasive text.

To write an introduction, you need to:

- Engage or 'grab' your reader's attention straight away - involve and interest them at the outset.
- State why you are writing
- Involve your reader by using 'you', 'we' - if appropriate!
- Use a rhetorical question.
- Choose your words with precision and care.
