For 2 marks, you must **retrieve** one piece of information from the text OR give your opinion and then **explain** your point. E.g. The spa is 'luxurious' (1) which makes the spa sound like a nice place to visit (1).

For 3 marks, you must **make your point**, give **evidence** and then **explain** how the evidence proves your point. E.g The spa is appealing to the readers (1). I know this because it describes the spa as "luxurious" (1). The fact that the spa is luxurious will appeal to readers because it implies that the spa is a special place to visit (1).

Please ensure that you take the time to add enough detail to your answers, paying close attention to the suggested marks at the side of each question.
