Last week, you gathered information about internet safety. We considered the slogan 'think before you send' and looked into different ways that we could be safe online.

What does the slogan 'think before you send mean to you?' Write your answer in your home learning book.

Using the notes that you gathered last week, we would like to create an eye-catching poster to be displayed around the school.

Success criteria

- 1) Your poster must be A4 size preferably on plain paper.
- 2) It can be landscape or portrait.
- 3) It must contain the phrase 'Think before you send'.
- 4) It must contain at least 2 key pieces of information from your notes. This could be questions to ask before you send, it could be facts and statistics about cyberbullying. Alternatively, it could be reminders about privacy and permission.
- 5) It must contain the contact information for Childline and who children can contact when in school. This information is in red below.
- 6) It must be eye-catching. Please use a range of colours and include some pictures or symbols that will catch the reader's eye.
- 7) It must be clear it can be read from a distance as a poster.

How you create your poster is up to you! We would like you to use the creative skills you have.


You could:

Here are some examples of how you could set out your poster.




Think before you click! e-Safety Rules


- On all the computers and internet I will use the correct username and password to log in
