- 7) Can you give an example of a sentence starter in this letter? An example of a sentence starter is 'In my opinion,', 'In addition,' or 'In January,'.
- 8) Why has Amanda asked a question at the beginning of the letter? Amanda has asked a question at the beginning of the letter to create a relationship with the reader. She has addressed them in a friendly tone by asking 'How are you?'.
- 9) What is the purpose of the final paragraph? The purpose of the final paragraph is to summarise your letter or say goodbye to the reader. For example, in this letter Amanda signs off with 'I am really looking forward to seeing you'.
- 10) Which person has the letter been written in and why? This letter has been written in first person. This is because Amanda is talking about her own experiences in Year 3, for example 'I cannot believe that next year I will be in Year 4'.
- 11) What other important information could Amanda have included in her letter?
 Answers will vary. Some examples Amanda could have included more information about Year 3, such as the names of the teachers or classes. She could also tell the new Year 2 child how many lessons they have each week of Maths, English and Foundation subjects.
