### **Hot extension**

You have been using the simple past tense. For example, I went to the park.

There is another type of past tense called the 'past progressive tense'. Also known as past continuous tense, the past progressive is a form of the past tense where an action goes on for a period of time in the past. The past progressive is formed by using the past for of the verb 'to be' as an auxiliary verb and by adding the suffix '-ing' to the main verb. For example, 'My teacher <u>was drinking</u> a cup of tea.' In the simple past tense, you would say 'My teacher <u>drank</u> a cup of tea'.
