Spicy - **nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, pronouns** and **conjunctions**

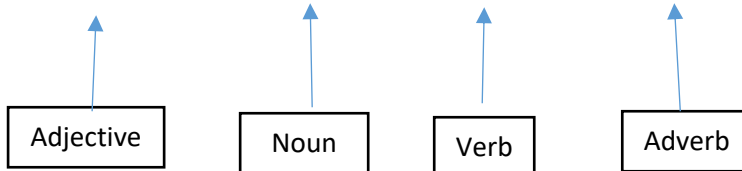
Hot - **nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, pronouns, conjunctions, determiners** and **prepositions**

<b>Word Classes</b>			
<p><b>Verbs</b></p> <p>A word that describes what a person or thing does.                      E.g. run, hit, grow.</p>	<p><b>Nouns</b></p> <p>A word that identifies a person, place or thing.                      E.g. woman, dog, building, London.</p>	<p><b>Adjectives</b></p> <p>A word that describes a noun.                      E.g. red, bad, giant, hairy, shy.</p>	<p><b>Adverbs</b></p> <p>A word that gives more information about a verb.                      E.g. lazily, easily.</p>
<p><b>Prepositions</b></p> <p>A word that describes the position of something, the time it happened or the way it is done                      E.g. under, between, on.</p>	<p><b>Conjunctions</b></p> <p>A word that connects, phrases or sentences.                      E.g. and, because, but, for, or.</p>	<p><b>Determiners</b></p> <p>A word that introduces a noun.                      E.g. an, a, every, this, those, the.</p>	<p><b>Pronouns</b></p> <p>A word that is used in place of a noun that is a specific person or thing.                      E.g. she, him, mine, we, I, us, me.</p>
