Curriculum Events

Black History Month

Black History Month has been marked in the UK for more than 30 years. It takes place during the month of October. It happens because so often in the past, the contributions to the community made by black people were ignored or played down. Black History Month aims to address this unfairness, by celebrating the achievements and contributions of the black community over the years. At Garden Suburb Junior School, we have focused on Black History month for many years. This year we will be incorporating aspects of black history throughout the year across the curriculum.

This week all year groups began their focus on an aspect of Black History:

Year 3 - Desmond Tutu who was once the curate at Golders Green Parish Church.

Year 4 – Ruby Bridges, the first African-American child to attend an all-white public elementary school in the American South.

Year 5 - Floella Benjamin's book 'Coming to England' and also 'The Windrush'.

Year 6 - Slavery and injustice.

World Mental Health Day – Wear Yellow to School on Monday 12th October

Saturday 10th October 2020 is World Mental Health Day. This day is dedicated to promoting the understanding of mental health education, awareness and advocacy.

On Monday, in class, the children will be talking about World Mental Health Day. They will be having class assemblies to discuss the importance of learning how to recognise and deal with difficult emotions or thoughts. To raise awareness, we are asking the children to wear something 'Yellow' on Monday. This can, of course, be their yellow school top or any other yellow garments they may have- hats, hairbands, trousers, etc.
