Assemblies and Curriculum Events

Diversity was the theme of assemblies this week. I particularly focused on how important it was that we treat everyone respectfully. I focused on explaining the medical condition diabetes.

Black History Month

Black History Month has been marked in the UK for more than 30 years. It takes place during the month of October. It happens because so often in the past, the contributions to the community made by black people were ignored or played down. Black History Month aims to address this unfairness, by celebrating the achievements and contributions of the black community over the years. At Garden Suburb Junior School, we have focused on Black History month for many years. We will be incorporating aspects of black history throughout the year across the curriculum.

All year groups began their focus on an aspect of Black History:

- Year 3 Desmond Tutu who was once the curate at Golders Green Parish Church.
- **Year 4** Ruby Bridges, the first African-American child to attend an all-white public elementary school in the American South.
- Year 5 Floella Benjamin's book 'Coming to England' and also 'The Windrush'.
- **Year 6** Slavery and injustice.
- Year 6 have been learning about the history of Kenwood House to mark Black History Month, particularly the importance of Lord Mansfield and his great niece Dido Belle. On Tuesday, Victoria Gordon, from English Heritage, visited the school to present an engaging talk to the children about the stately home and its complicated link to slavery in Georgian times. The children had the opportunity to look at items such as cotton, sugar cane and coffee beans and learnt how these items were part of the growing slave trade at the time. They then learnt about Dido Belle, Lord Mansfield's great niece, who challenged the stereotypes of her times and how her presence impacted her uncle's decisions as Lord Chief Justice of the King's Bench. They enjoyed challenging the ethics of the time and were passionate about making positive changes for the future.
- Year 6 ventured out into Hampstead Garden Suburb on Wednesday to learn about our local area. They visited St Jude's Church, Henrietta Barnett school and Big Wood Nature Reserve and enjoyed sketching the Free Church in Central Square. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring their area and hunting for blue plaques and were pleased to find local buildings linked to the figures after whom their houses are named: Barnett, Unwin, Melvin and Coates.
