



- Who reported the story? Have you heard of them before? Is it somewhere you trust?
- How do they describe themselves? Do they say they are a news company or journalist?
- What other stories have they shared? Do they seem believable?
- Does the web page look normal?
- Does the website address look normal?
- Is the writing formal, with correct spellings and punctuation?
- Does the headline match what the report is actually about?

When you search for a news story:

The same story is reported by other news companies you have heard of.

When you look at a report:

- The report uses a real photograph that shows the event, with a caption and credit.
- There are quotes from real sources.
- The report includes different sides of the story.
- The reporter is not just telling you their own opinion about what has happened.
- The facts are supported by evidence (such as quotes, images or statistics).
