Dear Parents and Carers

Playtimes

This week we have been trialing some timetable changes in order to maximise learning time and support managing behaviour in the playground.

The new timetable we are trialing is:

Whole school playtime 10:10am – 10:25am Whole school lunch time play at 12:20pm-1:20pm, however Year 3 go to lunch first at 12:15pm

We have been trialing separate playing areas for lower school and upper school which will be alternated each week.

This timetable change has had a positive impact on maximising learning time and has facilitated for three one-hour lessons in the morning and two one-hour lessons in the afternoon. It has also had a positive impact on the behaviour in the playground and prevented certain areas becoming overcrowded.

We know that the children, especially the upper school who have had the greatest change, are still adjusting and we are listening to their feedback.

We are going to continue the trial after the half term holiday and evaluate again at the end of the first week.

Reminder: We encourage you to provide a fruit/veg snack for your child to enjoy at playtime. We have noticed that many upper school children do not bring a snack. You might want to discuss this with your child as a snack may support better concentration, especially now that their longer learning block is after play.

- Safer Internet Day: On Monday, the Digital Leaders presented a whole-school assembly about the importance of staying safe online. They spoke about key issues that could be encountered in the online world and the importance of telling a trusted adult if they have any concerns or worries. On Safer Internet Day (Tuesday), Y3, Y4 and Y6 participated in a live lesson exploring some of the risks of online gaming and sharing practical tips of how to stay safe online. Y5 also completed internet safety related activities this week and read a book about social media in the digital age.

We have had a successful week learning about online safety and the Digital Leaders should be very proud of their contributions.
