Black History Month has been marked in the UK for more than 30 years. It takes place during the month of October. It happens because so often in the past, the contributions to the community made by black people were ignored or played down. Black History Month aims to address this unfairness, by celebrating the achievements and contributions of the black community over the years. At Garden Suburb Junior School, we have focused on Black History month for many years. We now incorporate aspects of black history throughout the year across the curriculum. All year groups began their focus on an aspect of Black History in October:

Year 3 - Desmond Tutu who was once the curate at Golders Green Parish Church. They will also look at Benjamin Zephaniah's new book "The Nature Trail" and also Jacob Lawrence's art

Year 4 - Ruby Bridges, the first African-American child to attend an all-white public elementary school in the American South.

Year 5 - Floella Benjamin's book 'Coming to England' and also 'The Windrush'. Year 6 - Slavery and injustice.

- Y6 Suburb Quest: This week, Year 6 ventured out into Hampstead Garden Suburb to learn about our local area. They visited St Jude's Church, Henrietta Barnett school and Big Wood Nature Reserve and enjoyed sketching the Free Church in Central Square. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring their area and hunting for blue plaques and were pleased to find local buildings linked to the figures after whom their houses are named: Barnett, Unwin, Melvin and Coates.
- Year 6 Visit to Kenwood: On Wednesday, Year 6 visited Kenwood House. They had a lovely day walking around the grounds and sketching points of interest, namely the 'Thousand Pound Pond' and sculptures by Henry Moore. They also attended an informative workshop in the mansion house where the children focused on the paintings of Dido Belle and the Murray family who used to live at the house during the 1700s. Dido Belle lived at Kenwood House for 31 years. Her position was unusual because she was born into slavery according to colonial law. Lord and Lady Mansfield brought her up as a member of the Murray family. This workshop introduced the children to the Y6 topic on slavery and injustice linked to this month's Black History focus. The children were really engaged and asked and answered lots of interesting questions.
- Year 4 Visit to Verulamium : The children learnt all about life as a Roman, explored a Roman Theatre, toured a Roman Museum, learnt about a Roman hypocaust and even had the chance to handle real artefacts from Roman times. The children participated and behaved extremely well.
